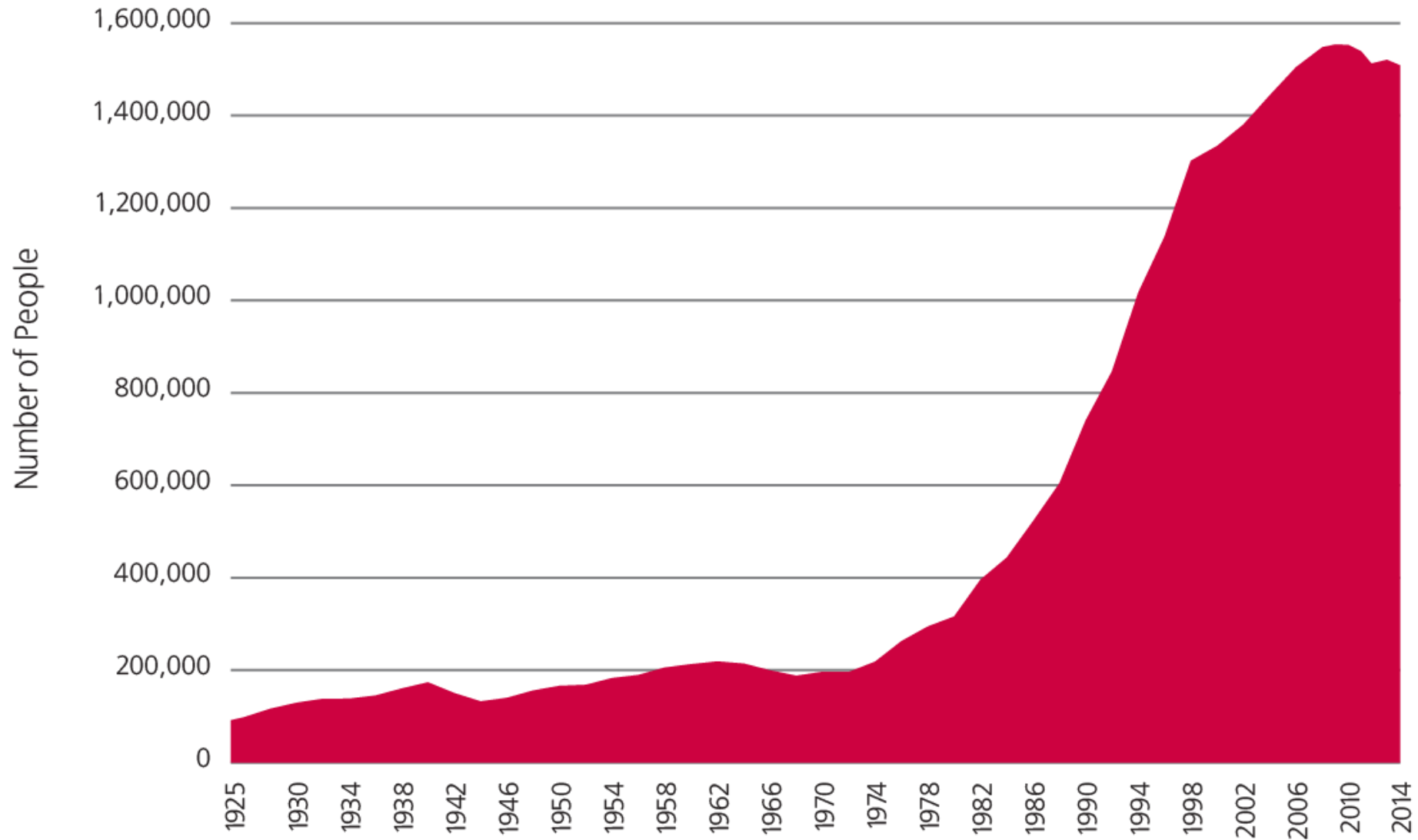
Drug Related Statistics

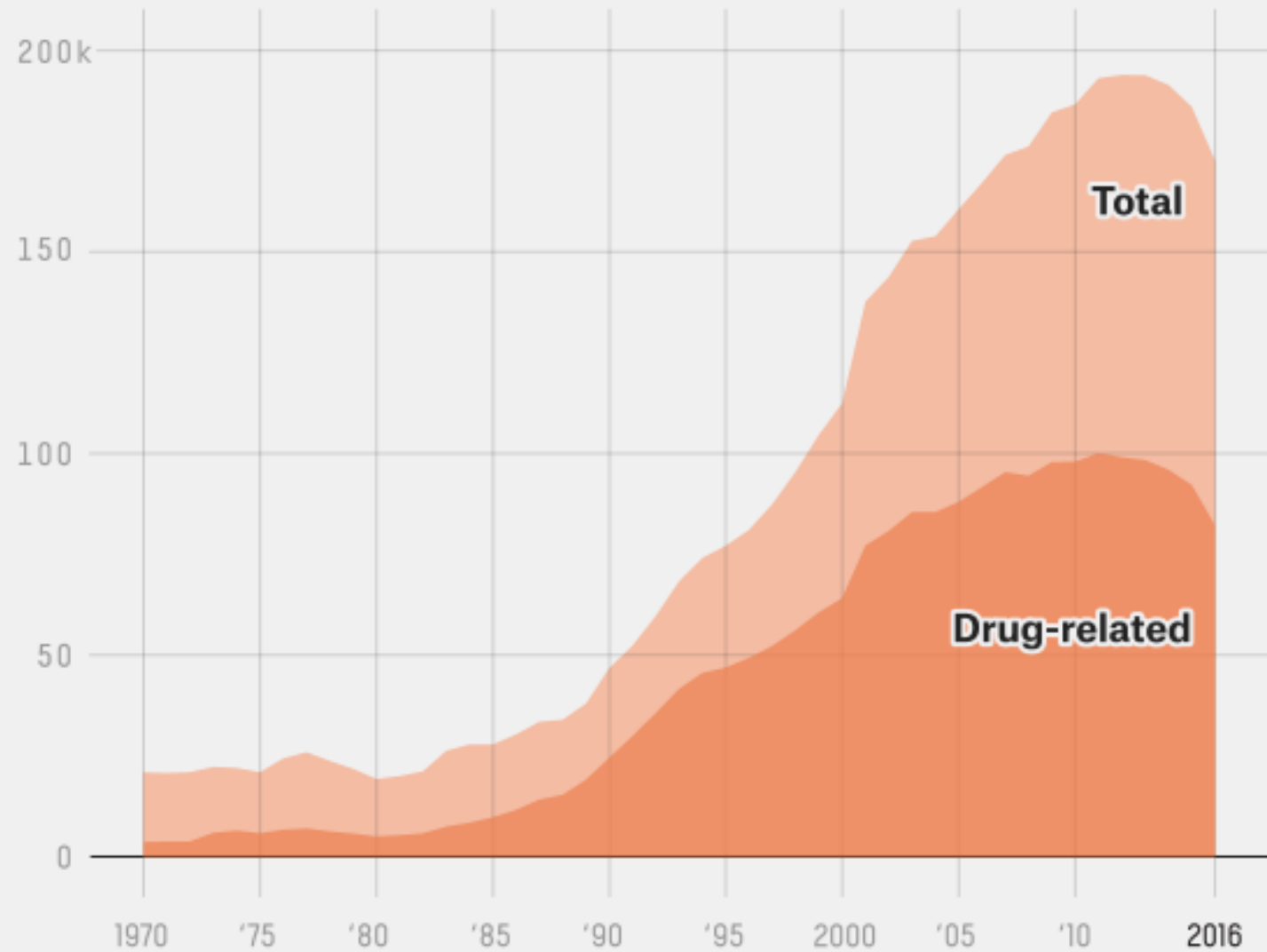
U.S. State and Federal Prison Population, 1925-2014

US Constitution - Preamble

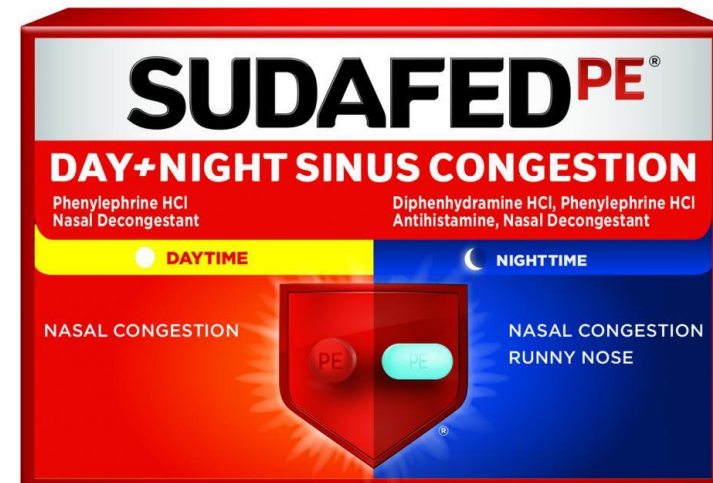



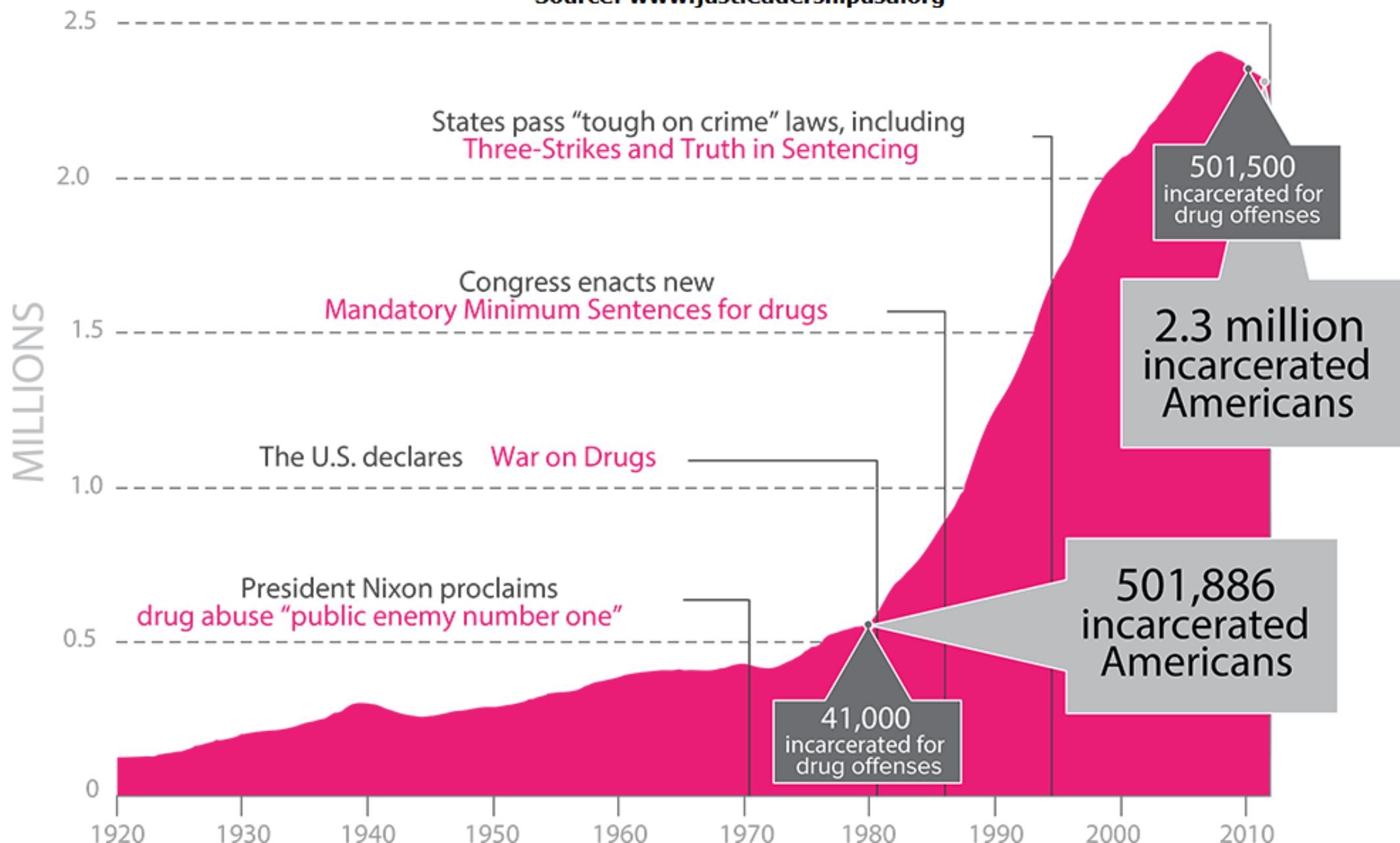
U.S. State and Federal Prison Population, 1925-2014

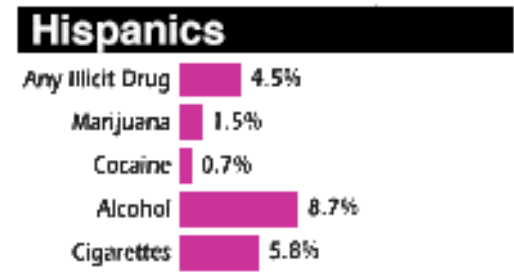
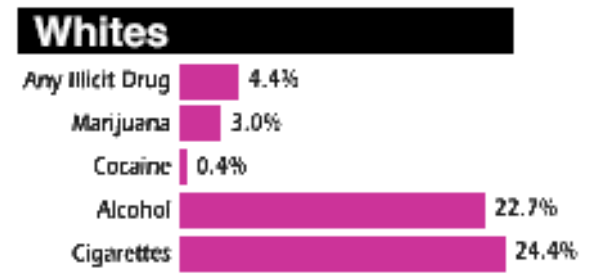
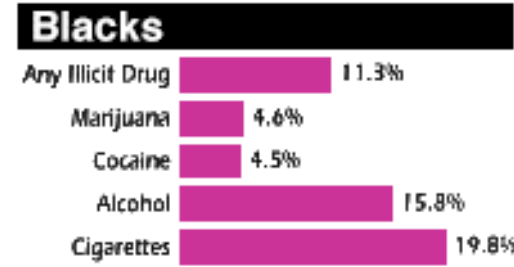
